Change in NC Seed Law — Penalty

§ 106-277.24. Penalty for violations.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Article or any rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall pay a fine of not more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000). This fine shall not apply, however, to a retailer with respect to any

transaction where the seed sold by the retailer was acquired by the retailer in a sealed container or package, or the retailer did not have reasonable knowledge that the seed sold was in violation of this Article. In determining the amount of the fine, the court shall consider the retail value of the seed sold in violation of the law, and in cases involving the unlawful sale of

seed protected under the federal Plant Variety Protection Act, the court shall order the payment of restitution to any injured party for any losses incurred as a result of the unlawful sale. (1941, c. 114, s. 8; 1945, c. 828; 1949, c. 725; 1963, c. 1182; 1993, c. 539, s. 758; 1994, Ex. Sess., c. 24, s. 14(c); 2013-345, s. 1(b).)

"State of NCCIA" Jan. 2014

I have been working on the year-end report to our Directors and I noticed some interesting trends in the number of acres we have inspected over the years. We inspected 82,400 acres this past year which exceeds the five year average by 20,000 acres, but falls short of the glory years (mid -80's to late 90's) when Crop Improvement regularly inspected over 140,000 acres annually. The five biggest seed crops produced in NC are small grains, peanuts, soybeans, turf and sweetpotatoes. Acreage of these crops has not declined since the 90's, so what happened? Why aren't we inspecting more acres? I can offer a few explanations: 1) GMO seed technology was granted utility patents, 2) public breeding programs shrinking with reduction in agricultural research funding 3) seed production more concentrated in fewer and larger companies, 4) private breeders releasing competitive varieties, and 5) seed companies relying on licensing agreements.

There are many factors influencing the demand for seed certification and third-party inspections, perhaps the most significant event that influenced certification is the granting of utility patents to plants. Plant utility patents were first granted to the Roundup Ready technology allowing companies to protect their seed technology without obtaining a Plant Variety Protection (PVP) Certificate. Seed certification was no longer necessary and growers were not allowed to save their own anymore. Additionally, seed companies were developing their own quality control programs and doing a good job producing high quality seed without the help of Crop Improvement. The effect has been significant; Crop Improvement inspected over 60,000 acres of certified, PVP protected soybeans, in 1980's contrasting 2013 when we inspected less than 2,000 acres of certified soybeans.

Reduction in support of agricultural research has also played a significant role by shifting the balance of public breeding programs toward private breeding programs. Public breeding programs have received smaller budgets to fund their research, and they are forced to find creative ways to sustain themselves. More public breeders are selling varieties with exclusive licenses to private companies; in most case, certification by a third-party is not required. Royalties from these variety releases are necessary to keep breeding programs alive with the loss of public support. Furthermore, most public breeding programs have been successful at training new plant breeders who are

seeking employment with private companies. Seed companies are developing their own breeding programs and we should see the fruits of their labor in years to come.

Seed certification is not as popular as it used to be. We see the same trend nationally and we do not see that trend changing in the near future. That is the environment we live in and Crop Improvement must learn to adapt and prove our value to seed producers and buyers alike. For the seed producer we can serve as an audit tool, a pair of boots in the field, a keeper of traceable records, and as a pseudo-enforcement agency in the event of patent/PVP infringement. To the seed buyer, we serve as quality control agents, provide confidence that the certified seed meets national standards, and serve as a go between with seed producers. Our value lies in maintaining our third party unbiased status and providing high quality seed services.

NEWS from NCDA

Danny Turner, Seed and Fertilizer Administrator, NC Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, reports that the Seed Lab has tested a variety of crops - from field to vegetable and some grasses. The table below is a recap of all work completed by the Seed Lab since January. The second table shows some of the many different plant seeds that have had tests completed this year. You can see that the lab has been very busy the last couple months getting results ready for Spring planting. If anyone has seed they would like tested, they can submit a sample to the lab. A sample test request form can be found online at: www.ncagr.gov/ plantindustry/seedfertilizersection for collecting the information needed from the person sending in the sample for testing.
